Lighting the Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is shaped in a ring. It shows the circle of God's unbroken love. Each week we will invite a "family" to light the candles in the wreath. This week the Deacons will light the candles to bring us together in the warm light of God's love.

Lighter 1: The Gospel of Luke speaks about the future:
"There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars,
and on earth, distress among nations.
People will faint from fear and foreboding." (*Luke 21:25-36*)

Lighter 2: Because our world is full of fear and distress,
we light our first candle,
trusting that Christ is alive on earth
and that the Spirit of Christ lives among us.

(Light the first candle)

Lighter 1: Living Christ, give us faith to trust you.

All: We trust you, we love you, we praise you. Amen.

That we may ease their burdens
And that God's loving presence may come even closer in the
coming week.**

Leader: God of the future,
make us ready for the coming of your reign,
when you will bring everlasting peace
and renew the face of the earth;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A Prayer to Send us Back Out into the World (a riff on Psalm 122)

Leader: Let's celebrate every invitation to come nearer to God's presence.

All: Wherever our feet are standing, let us take a minute to realize we are in God's presence.

Leader: God has built a world that is woven tightly together, with each piece affecting the *shalom*, the peace, of all.

All: All the tribes of the world are invited into God's peace, where they can give thanks for the life they have been given.

Leader: God offers us a system of justice, especially for the weak and the vulnerable. To build that justice into our human systems lets us build a bit of God's kingdom into our daily lives.

All: We pray that the peace of God's kingdom will sweep through the world, that all will be safe from war and its ravages, from treason and betrayal that shatter communities as completely as combat.

Leader: For the sake of the people I know and love, I say "peace be within you."

All: For the sake of the people we do not know and yet still love with the love Jesus taught us, we say "We will seek your good.

Questions for Reflection

What does it mean to “get your house in order” for the coming of the Lord? Can we ever be perfectly ready for Christ’s return? Why is the coming of the Lord compared to a thief in the night? Is there grace in God’s surprising advent, God’s unexpected arrival?

Daily Awareness Reflection²

At the end of the day, I’ve been asking myself the following questions. I jot down the answers and ask them again the next evening. I’ve found it helps me to remain centered as well as increasing my awareness of God in my life. It takes about 10 minutes.

1. Slow down. Stop. Prepare yourself to pray by becoming aware of the love with which God looks on you ...
2. Note the gifts God has given you today. Give thanks to God for them ...
3. Ask God that this be a time of special grace and revelation ...
4. With God, review the day. Look at the stirrings of your heart, your thoughts, and your choices as the day progressed. Which have been of God? Which have not? What does God want to say to you about both? ...
5. Ask for forgiveness for failures/omissions, for healing from their effects ...
6. Look forward to the following day, and plan concretely with God how to live it according to God’s desire for your life ...
