Marguerite's Place consists of 10 apartments in two buildings on Palm St in Nashua along with a licensed child care facility onsite. Let's help these women as they transition from homelessness to self-sufficiency with the help of the many programs at Marguerite's Place. After moving in, residents partner with a case manager who provides these women with individualized support, career/financial coaching, and connection to vital community resources to help them create a plan for their future.
