

Notes:			

Psalm 139

The dilemma for readers of Psalm 139 is how to connect the often-quoted beautiful poetic imagery of verses 1-18 with the shocking petition against enemies in verses 19-22. The key root word in the psalm is "know". God's knowing runs through verses 1-18 and undergirds verses 19-24.

Verses 1-6. In the psalm's first poetic unit, God knows the entire life of the speaker: sitting down, rising up, thinking, lying down, walking, and speaking. God examines and knows the speaker completely. First- and second-person pronouns dominate these verses, suggesting that the relationship between God and the speaker – the I-Thou relationship – is the central focus.

Verses 7-12. The divine presence is more encompassing than the speaker can imagine; the poetic imagery is remarkable. The affirmation of the divine present in *Sheol*, the underworld, is most unusual. Most psalms portray *Sheol* as a place of divine absence. As judge of all the earth, God sees all.

Verses 13-18. This poetic unit affirms that God was present at the beginning of the speaker's life. So from the beginning God has known this person who is "fearfully and wonderfully made."

Verses 19-24. The prayer is an urgent plea that God defeat the enemies and remove their injustice from the petitioner's world. In the context of the close I-Thou relationship so powerfully expressed in this psalm, the petitioner urges God to make an end of these evil ones. They loathe God and the faithful of the worshipping community, so the speaker confesses as an act of trust, to hating and loathing these enemies of God and the faithful. The petitioner hopes that God will see that this faithful one is not among the evil ones who oppose God and will lead the speaker in the ways of faith.

Daily Awareness Reflection³

At the end of the day, I've been asking myself the following questions. I jot down the answers and ask them again the next evening. I've found it helps me to remain centered as well as increasing my awareness of God in my life. It takes about 10 minutes.

- 1. Slow down. Stop. Prepare yourself to pray by becoming aware of the love with which God looks on you ...
- 2. Note the gifts God has given you today. Give thanks to God for them ...
- 3. Ask God that this be a time of special grace and revelation ...
- 4. With God, review the day. Look at the stirrings of your heart, your thoughts, and your choices as the day progressed. Which have been of God? Which have not? What does God want to say to you about both? ...
- 5. Ask for forgiveness for failures/omissions, for healing from their effects ...
- 6. Look forward to the following day, and plan concretely with God how to live it according to God's desire for your life ...
