# Lighting the Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is shaped in a ring. It shows the circle of God's unbroken love. Each week we will invite a family to light the candles in the wreath to bring us together in the warm light of God's love.

- Lighter 1: The Gospel of Luke speaks about God's messenger: In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberias, ... the word of God came to John son of Zechariah .... He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. (*Luke 3:1-3*)
- Lighter 2: God comes to us through particular people, in particular places and times in the past, and here and now. Our second candle reminds us to look for the light of God in God's messengers today.

(Light the first & second purple candles)

Lighter 1: Living Christ, give us faith to trust you And hope to follow you.

# All: We trust you, we love you, we praise you. Amen.

# Hymn: Advent Song, Week 2

Light the Advent candle two, Think of humble shepherds who; Filled with wonder at the sight, Of the child on Christmas night.

# Reflection on the First Scripture: Genesis 18:1-15, p. 12

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, 'My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.' And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.' Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, 'Where is your wife Sarah?' And he said, 'There, in the tent.' Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.' And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, 'After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?' The Lord said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh, and say, "Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?" Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son.' But Sarah denied, saying, 'I did not laugh'; for she was afraid. He said, 'Oh yes, you did laugh.'

# Daily Awareness Reflection<sup>2</sup>

At the end of the day, I've been asking myself the following questions. I jot down the answers and ask them again the next evening. I've found it helps me to remain centered as well as increasing my awareness of God in my life. It takes about 10 minutes.

- 1. Slow down. Stop. Prepare yourself to pray by becoming aware of the love with which God looks on you ...
- 2. Note the gifts God has given you today. Give thanks to God for them ...
- 3. Ask God that this be a time of special grace and revelation ...
- 4. With God, review the day. Look at the stirrings of your heart, your thoughts, and your choices as the day progressed. Which have been of God? Which have not? What does God want to say to you about both? ...
- 5. Ask for forgiveness for failures/omissions, for healing from their effects ...
- 6. Look forward to the following day, and plan concretely with God how to live it according to God's desire for your life ...
