**Scripture Reading: John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15**

[John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15 [read for you](#)]

'When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning.

'I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, "Where are you going?" But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgement: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgement, because the ruler of this world has been condemned.

'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

**Reflection on the Scripture:**

Here we are celebrating Pentecost. The joy of Easter is so big, we need weeks to fit it in every year. Pentecost is the last Sunday in Eastertide. We celebrate that the divine is with us still, every day, here on this earth, in the form of the Holy Spirit. Often on Pentecost, we read the story from Acts, which describes the

tongues of fire over the disciples' heads. This year, I thought we'd focus on the reading from John where Jesus describes what will happen when he's gone.

Today's reading comes in the heart of Jesus' Farewell Address. Jesus has joined his followers in the upper room for the Passover Meal, after a triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The next day, he will be tried and sentenced and executed on the Cross. At the Last Supper, Jesus begins by kneeling down to wash their feet, their sore and dusty feet that have walked with him all over Israel. He ends the evening in a prayer to God, asking God to protect his followers and guide them in their work. And in the middle, he talks about what it means, what we have to do, to be a follower of Jesus.

Now Jesus is never going to go viral with his message. He's not going to get many clicks on his post, because he says the same thing over and over. In the Farewell Discourse, the longest thing we hear Jesus say,<sup>2</sup> fifteen times Jesus says he is leaving, twenty-six times he refers to the Spirit he and God are sending. But the leaving and the sending are how the work of being a follower of Jesus gets done. Jesus has shown us the Way, now it's our turn and the Spirit is here to help us, to go along with us.

Jesus is leaving, the Holy Spirit is coming. "I am leaving... I am sending...". Call and response, we weave the work of God together. Go through the Farewell Discourse and you hear the shuttle passing back and forth through the loom. Jesus is leaving, the Holy Spirit is coming.

Everything Jesus said and did among them is continued in what they say and do.

I washed your feet; you wash one another's feet (John 13:14)

I have loved you; you love one another (John 13:34, 15:12)

You've seen me; you'll see the Father (John 14:9)

You've seen me work; you'll do my work (John 14:12)

I've been with you; the Spirit will be with you (John 14:16-17)

I live; you also will live (John 14:19)

You are in me; I am in you (John 14:20)

I am teaching you; the Spirit will teach/remind you (John 14:25-26)

Abide in me; I abide in you (John 15:4)

I was hated; you will be hated (John 15:18-25)

The Spirit will testify; you will testify (John 15:26-27)

I go away; the Spirit will come (John 16:7)

I haven't finished what I have to say; the Spirit will tell you (John 16:12-15)

Jesus is leaving, the Holy Spirit is coming.

Get on our knees, get our hands dirty taking care of someone else. Talk about, witness to, the work that we do for Jesus. Do the work and say out loud what the work is. Then lift our faces to heaven and pray. And in Jesus' prayer during the Farewell Address, Jesus makes more explicit the congruence between what he did while he was with us and what we'll do after he leaves.

I am no longer in the world; they are in the world (John 17:11)

Father, we are one; may they be one (John 17:11, 22, 23)

I don't belong to the world; they don't belong to the world (John 17:16)

You sent me into the world; I send them into the world (John 17:16)

I sanctify myself; they are sanctified in truth (John 17:19)

You are in me and I in you; may they also be in us (John 17:21)

You love me; you love them (John 17:23, 26)

Jesus is leaving, the Holy Spirit is coming.

Easter is a time of celebrating new life, of seeing life where there was only death before. Pentecost is the moment when we mark the end of the celebration and turn back to normal life. Jesus is no longer with us in the flesh, Jesus has left, but the Holy Spirit has come. But how do we make that turn? How do we keep ahold of the miracle that death is defeated for all time? How do we translate what we know about caring for each other, loving each other, experiencing the love of God in our daily lives in this world which really, really does not want to know about that?

We do it the way Jesus taught us to all those years ago. Get on our knees, get our hands dirty taking care of someone else. Talk about, witness to, the work that we do for Jesus. Do the work and say out loud what the work is. Then lift our faces to heaven and pray.

Jesus is leaving, the Holy Spirit is coming.

### **Questions for Reflection**

In this coming week consider how many ways and through which persons you are shown a new path for your life. Watch for startling nudges or sudden epiphanies; listen for sighs that signal letting go of something pressing so that you can hear the Spirit's guidance. What have you learned? How can you give thanks?

### **Daily Awareness Reflection<sup>4</sup>**

At the end of the day, I've been asking myself the following questions. I jot down the answers and ask them again the next evening. I've found it helps me to remain centered as well as increasing my awareness of God in my life. It takes about 10 minutes.

1. Slow down. Stop. Prepare yourself to pray by becoming aware of the love with which God looks on you ...
2. Note the gifts God has given you today. Give thanks to God for them ...
3. Ask God that this be a time of special grace and revelation ...
4. With God, review the day. Look at the stirrings of your heart, your thoughts, and your choices as the day progressed. Which have been of God? Which have not? What does God want to say to you about both? ...
5. Ask for forgiveness for failures/omissions, for healing from their effects ...
6. Look forward to the following day, and plan concretely with God how to live it according to God's desire for your life ...
