## Lighting the Advent Wreath<sup>2</sup>

The Advent wreath is shaped in a ring. It shows the circle of God's unbroken love. Each week we will invite a "family" to light the candles in the wreath. This week the folks who handle the finance and administration of the church will light the candles to bring us together in the warm light of God's love.

Lighter 1: In the Gospel of Luke, John the Baptizer points to Jesus:  
as the people were filled with expectation, ...  
questioning whether John might be the Messiah,  
John answered them by saying,  
"I baptize you with water,  
but one who is more powerful than I is coming ...  
He will baptize you  
with the Holy Spirit and fire." (*Luke 3:15-16*)

Lighter 2: If we follow Jesus Christ,  
we will get everything we hope for,  
and more than we bargained for  
We light our third candle to praise God  
whose Spirit comes to us  
with disturbing and wonderful blessings.  
(Light the pink candle)

Lighter 1: Living Christ, give us faith to trust you  
hope to follow you,  
and love to live for you.

**All: We trust you, we love you, we praise you. Amen.**

### **Words of Remembering**

Leader: We remember that Jesus was always  
about more chairs –  
for the “friendly beasts”  
a cow whose manger fed him,  
the birds that never fall unloved,  
and the comforting animals  
of his forty wilderness days.

All: **Jesus was always about more chairs,  
for the poor, lonely, grieving, hungry,  
the most vulnerable and rejected,  
and even those deep in deserved regret.**

Leader: And we remember that Jesus  
sat in the chairs of anyone who welcomed him.  
He came to tables and asked for food,  
not to see the guest list.  
He knew how multiply barley loaves  
but, also, how to grill fish.

All: **In this sacrament on Advent’s day of Joy,  
we remember that the starlit Child,  
protected by angels  
grew up to offer bread and cup  
to a betrayer, a denier, a doubter,  
several sleepers, many who fled  
because at the cross there were no angels.**

Leader: We remember that Jesus is in the Bread and Cup  
for those of us who know its blessing well,  
and yet is still pulling out folding chairs  
so that more, ... even all

All: **can come, sit, rest, eat.**

### **Scripture Reading: Luke 3:7-18**

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.'

And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.' Even tax-collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.'

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

### **Questions for Reflection**

Imagine that you are in the crowd listening to John the Baptizer. You hear people in the crowd asking him, "What should we do to prepare?" How might John instruct you, or your church, to prepare for the coming of God's reign?

Sometimes wealthy people worry that God or the church is requiring them to be poor. What is the difference between being poor and being fair? How do you feel about sharing?

### **Daily Awareness Reflection<sup>5</sup>**

At the end of the day, I've been asking myself the following questions. I jot down the answers and ask them again the next evening. I've found it helps me to remain centered as well as increasing my awareness of God in my life. It takes about 10 minutes.

1. Slow down. Stop. Prepare yourself to pray by becoming aware of the love with which God looks on you ...
2. Note the gifts God has given you today. Give thanks to God for them ...
3. Ask God that this be a time of special grace and revelation ...
4. With God, review the day. Look at the stirrings of your heart, your thoughts, and your choices as the day progressed. Which have been of God? Which have not? What does God want to say to you about both? ...
5. Ask for forgiveness for failures/omissions, for healing from their effects ...
6. Look forward to the following day, and plan concretely with God how to live it according to God's desire for your life ...
