Scripture Reading

[Mark 7:24-30](#)

From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet.

Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter.

He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."

But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs."

Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter."

So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

Reflection on the Scripture

While looking for a good reading for Mother's Day, these passages came to mind. In Mark 7:24-30 the Mother was asking for Help for her sick child. I constantly see examples of Mothers putting their children ahead of themselves, and to me that is practicing what we hear in Church. There is something special about Mothers and Grandmothers ability to see when child is not well, and they give everything they have to help the child with whatever is bothering them. I recall coming home after a fight with a neighborhood kid, and not wanting to show my feelings, but my Mom saw thru my attempt at covering up my feelings and asked what was wrong. So many times in my life I had problems that I thought were insurmountable, and my Mom would be able to provide me with the right words or come up with a plan to get me back on track.

Proverbs 31:25-30 spoke to me recalling the hard road my mother has been on, and how she has handled herself with Grace and Dignity. After my parents got divorced, it was an extremely stressful time for my Mom. She had passed on her career to take care of her 3 children, one of who is deaf since birth and required far more care. She was facing an uncertain future full of responsibility with little resources. I recall seeing her study at the dining room table to become a registered nurse after coming home from working a full shift at a local nursing home in order to provide for her the 3 children on her own. She graduated from Massasoit Community College, passed her RN exams, and began getting better jobs including working at Mount Auburn Hospital in Cambridge, and later at the world famous Mass Eye and Ear in Boston. All this time managing to make sure her children and household were in order, despite the efforts of her children to create havoc and chaos at every possible turn. Even now she has 2 adult children living at home. As a parent who has a son who has not managed to flap his wings very hard to leave the nest, I know that the best Mother's Day gift is seeing a child be able to stand up on their own feet and become a contributing member to society. So, today's service is dedicated to the Mothers who stand by their children through thick and thin.

I would like to open the service to anyone who might want to share a name and perhaps an example of how a mother, grandmother, stepmother or other female helped them become the person they are today.

Brookline Food Pantry

Although we cannot be together physically at this time, Outreach is continuing to work with Rebecca Purdin through the Brookline Welfare office & CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) to address our community's needs.

As always, perishable items such as bread, cheese, butter, eggs, meats, and milk can be donated during open pantry hours: Tues and Thurs, 10am - 2pm.
